FOLLOW THE STUDENT

Earning a postsecondary credential is increasingly important — to individuals and their ability to earn family-supporting wages, and to California as we face an acute shortage of qualified workers. The James Irvine Foundation Youth program strategy aims to prepare young people for success on this educational journey, from high school to postsecondary completion.



Increase the number of low-income young people in California who complete **high school on time** and earn a postsecondary credential **BY AGE 25.**



INCOME DISPARITY

Complete program of study prerequisites

PROGRESS PERIL

start in remedial courses, extending time and money to degree and reducing their odds of completion
